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Eyes on the region

The RDA Goldfields Esperance Board invited Sue Budalich, the region's new Education, Skills, Jobs (ESJ) Coordinator to present at its' recent Board meeting in Esperance.

Sue, who is employed by the Department of Education, Employment & Workplace Relations (DEEWR), is one of 34 ESJ Coordinators appointed to regions across Australia. Sue commenced in her new role on 30 January, 2012.

One of the key tasks of the new ESJ Coordinators will be to identify trends, issues and gaps in education, skills and employment across the regions and develop a plan to address these issues. Sue will examine the *Goldfields Esperance Strategic Development Plan* and the *Goldfields Futures Plan* in order to inform the implementation plan she will be drafting.

Some of the key issues to be addressed by the new ESJ Coordinator include: childhood development; rates of high school completion; improving pathways into higher education; increasing traineeships and apprenticeships; Indigenous employment; and, labour market shortages.

Strategic Workshop with Local Government

A strategic planning workshop will be conducted by RDA Goldfields Esperance (RDAGE), in conjunction with the Goldfields Voluntary Regional Organisation of Councils (GVROC).

The workshop will be held on Wednesday February 29th at the offices of the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder and will involve representatives from RDAGE, and the Shires of Coolgardie, Dundas, Esperance, Laverton, Leonora, Menzies, Ngaanyatjarraku, Ravensthorpe and the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder.

The workshop will review the projects and strategies contained in the *Goldfields Esperance Strategic Development Plan 2011-2021* to capture the priorities of all communities in the region.

RDAGE partners with all three levels of government to develop solutions to local challenges.

Clean Energy Future

The Government has a comprehensive plan to move to a clean energy future. This includes:

- Introducing a carbon price, promoting innovation and investment in renewable energy, encouraging energy efficiency, creating opportunities in the land sector to cut pollution.

There are many opportunities available for households, land holders, businesses, community organisations, Local Government, research organisations and regions strongly impacted by the carbon price

Recently announced programs include:

Community Energy Efficiency Program - \$200 million

To assist local government, not-for-profit and community organisations to undertake energy efficiency upgrades to community infrastructure, including council buildings, stadiums, education facilities, town halls and nursing homes.

While funding for wind and solar power systems are not considered eligible for this program, solar hot water systems are eligible as they are not classified as renewable energy generation systems.

Low Income Energy Efficient program - \$100 million

To support groups of service providers to demonstrate smarter energy use in low income households across Australia. Purchase and installation of renewable energy generation systems, such as solar photovoltaic, microhydro, wind turbine and biomass generation systems are not eligible, but solar hot water is as it is not classed as a generation system.

Energy Efficiency Information Grants program - \$40 million

To support small and medium sized businesses and community groups by providing information and advice to make smarter energy choices.

"The programs will enable all Australians regardless of where they live or how much they earn to harness the opportunities of a low carbon future. They will be delivered in partnership with business, councils and community groups."

Department name change

On Monday 12 December 2011 Prime Minister of Australia, the Hon Julia Gillard MP, announced changes to Cabinet, including changes to the responsibilities of departments and agencies.

As a result the (former) Department of Regional Australia, Regional Development and Local Governments will be a stand-alone portfolio called the **Department of Regional Australia**, **Local Government**, **Arts and Sport**.

The Hon. Simon Crean MP will continue as Minister for Regional Australia, Regional Development and Local Government and Minister for the Arts. Senator the Hon Mark Arbib will be joining the portfolio in his role as Minister for Sport.

Satellite Subsidy Scheme

Analog TV signals will be gradually phased out across the country between 2010 and 2013 and Australia TV will become digital-only.

Households in regional and remote areas that currently rely on TV reception from a local analog self-help tower, which is not being converted to digital, may be eligible for the Satellite Subsidy Scheme.

Under the Satellite Subsidy Scheme, the Australian Government will subsidise the installation of satellite TV equipment (a VAST set-top box and satellite dish) in eligible households.

The subsidy will be rolled out progressively across Australia. Households will receive a letter inviting them to apply for the subsidy when it opens in their area.
